

# From the Streets to the Seminary

For years, **Leo Taveras** wandered the streets, trying to answer one question: Who am I?

He searched for love in all the wrong places. Gangs, violence, drugs—it all became part of the life he used to survive. He wore the mask of a tough guy, but underneath, he was a broken young man aching to be seen. He was angry. Addicted. Lost.

But in 2015, everything changed. One night, tired of only calling out to God when he was desperate, Leo made a decision that would alter his life forever. He said, “I’m not just going to seek God in my trouble. I’m going to draw close to Him in everything.”

As he pressed in, something remarkable began to happen. God started revealing not just who He was—but who Leo was in Christ. The chains of addiction started to break. The urge to use? Gone. The anger? Fading. For the first time in his life, Leo felt peace.

And then came the call. In the summer of 2016, Leo sensed God leading him into ministry. God was calling him to be a preacher! No one would have believed it—not even Leo.


## But when God calls, He equips.

That’s when Leo found Grace School of Theology. The name alone stopped him in his tracks. “Grace” was the very thing that had saved his life. He couldn’t believe a school so grounded in truth could also be so affordable and accessible. As a full-time truck driver with a family, it felt like a door only God could open. Leo enrolled and never looked back.

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Over the next four years, Grace School of Theology didn’t just teach him theology—it transformed the way he saw salvation, discipleship, and ministry. ***He learned that God’s grace isn’t just about getting people into heaven—it’s about bringing heaven to earth through everyday lives changed by Jesus.***

In 2019, Leo launched ***Shine Light Ministries***, a community-focused outreach that helps others experience the same freedom he found. He now leads, teaches, and discipiles with boldness and compassion—reaching people still stuck in the dark places he once called home. And he’s not done!



Today, Leo is finishing his bachelor’s degree with Grace—and dreaming of a master’s. He says his journey with Grace isn’t just about education. It’s about preparation. ***“Grace has equipped me in ways I never thought possible,”*** Leo says. ***“It enhanced my thinking, deepened my understanding, and helped me teach God’s Word in truth.”***

# Lasting Impact

## Aggies for the Nations

For years, **Grace School of Theology** has been empowering and partnering with students not only to study the Word but to live it out—and **Aggies for the Nations** is a powerful reflection of that. In December 2024, Grace hosted 17 athletes from Texas A&M on a mission trip to Panama, partnering with former student and missionary Randy Weets. Randy set up three days of sports camps for these Aggies to not only share their love of sports, but they also had the opportunity to share their love for Jesus with over a hundred students and indigenous people. It was a transformative experience!

**Aggies for the Nations** will be returning to Panama December 2025, to be the hands and feet of Jesus through simple acts of love and bold conversations.



*During my time in Panama, I saw how powerfully God moves through service and humility. Whether playing with children or speaking with the tribe, I felt His presence in every moment. Being with a community so hungry for both physical and spiritual nourishment renewed my appreciation for the gospel's simplicity. # Grace's Generosity at Work: *Pastor Christopher "Tof" De Guzman*

For nearly two decades, **Pastor Christopher "Tof" De Guzman** has faithfully served his church in Laguna, Philippines. But despite his long years in ministry, he still considered himself a student pastor—hungry to grow, deepen his knowledge of God's Word, and become better equipped to shepherd others.

In 2016, a friend invited him to explore Grace School of Theology. What started as a simple recommendation turned into a life-changing journey. "The first time I set foot at Grace, I felt like I belonged," Tof recalls.

Coming from a Reformed background, Tof initially wrestled with the school's theological distinctives—especially the core of Free Grace Theology. But over time, the message that God's love is unearned and unlosable began to settle into his heart and transform his perspective. Grace's culture of compassion, open dialogue, and community became not just a place of learning—but of healing.

Yet Tof's journey wasn't without hardship. While pursuing his degree, the COVID-19 pandemic struck. Tof got sick and failed Greek—twice. The first time, he was battling COVID. The second, he was diagnosed with a more serious condition. He sent a letter to his academic advisor saying he was ready to give up.


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# But Grace didn't give up on him.

In reviewing his progress, Grace helped Tof realize that he had actually completed all the requirements for his Master of Arts in Biblical Studies—except for Greek, which was only required for his Master of Divinity. This was the turning point in his journey with Grace. He was encouraged to apply for graduation and was inspired to continue his studies.

In 2023, Tof marched in Texas—thousands of miles from home—celebrating not just a diploma, but a victory over doubt, illness, and discouragement. “I was ready to quit,” he said. “But Grace reminded me that I had already come so far. That changed everything.”



Thanks to Grace’s scholarship support that made it possible, Tof didn’t just earn a degree. He became a better teacher of the Word. A more confident pastor. A more grounded Christian. “Jesus used Grace to change my life—not just my ministry, but my heart. I grew as a person, as a pastor, and most importantly, as a follower of Jesus.”

Today, Pastor Tof continues to lead Christian Home Baptist Church (CHBC), where he ministers to over 100 members. And he’s not stopping yet—he recently finished his Master of Divinity, with eyes set on a Doctor of Ministry afterward.


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# Financial Accountability


FY 2018-2024
